Description

Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For everything in the world—the cravings of sinful man, the lust of his eyes and the boasting of what he has and does—comes not from the Father but from the world. The world and its desires pass away, but the man who does the will of God lives forever. (1 John 2:15-17)

We want more of God. We want to live lives that are pleasing to God and show that we value the time we have been given.

Is there something in your life that distracts you from spending quality time with those you care about? Is there something in your life that distracts you from quality time with God? Take time this week to seriously look at the distractions in your life and ask God to help you remove them. Let's draw near to God and watch what He can do when we are fully surrendered to His purpose. May the world and its desires slowly fade from view, as we focus on Christ and all that He has for us.
