I would love to give you the background and history of all that was going on in Jonah's life at this time, but that would be a huge devotional. Basically, Jonah had been given a call from God to go and give a message to Nineveh. He was a prophet, so this was the norm in his life. He had received messages like this in the past from God, the only thing different this time was his response. The Bible says he ran. He wanted to actually flee from God's presence, as if that's possible. He chartered a ship and left for Tarshish. He went in the opposite direction that God had called him in. In fact, he went about 6 months journey from Nineveh. He really wanted to get away! How many of us have run when God asked something of us? It's not always easy to forgive, to love, to turn the other cheek, to turn away from sin, and just embrace God's best! Sometimes we get the Jonah-Run mentality! Unfortunately, no matter how fast you run or how far you run, you can't escape God!

The story continues with a storm that arose and the storm brought fear to everyone on the ship.

Everyone, but Jonah that is. He was sound asleep. The sailors started crying out to their gods to save them. Nothing was working, so they started throwing their cargo overboard. The very thing that supplied the needs of their family and their household. After this didn't work, they cast lots to see who was responsible for the storm. The lot fell on Jonah, so they woke him up and asked him to call on his God. Surely, he had a better answer for this storm. Well, Jonah gives even a better solution. He offers to be thrown overboard since he is the cause of this storm; the cause of the pain that the sailors are suffering. Has your storm ever caused pain for someone in your life?
