And we know [with great confidence] that God [who is deeply concerned about us] causes all things to work together [as a plan] for good for those who love God, to those who are called according to His plan and purpose. (Romans 8:28, AMP)

I learned a valuable lesson this last week. I was still caught up in my brokenness from a family dilemma. My heart was broken and I was trying to put the pieces back together. I kept seeking the Lord and asking when this would heal completely. During one of my prayers, the Lord gently reminded me that beauty comes from brokenness. But because of it's broken nature a new beauty was revealed to me.

The beauty I saw in the shell is the very beauty that the Holy Spirit impressed on my heart and reminded me that God is working all things together for good (Romans 8:28). God is always at work even when we can't see the work that He is doing. We can trust Him and learn to embrace the beauty that He wants to bring through the darkest times of our lives.

Let's focus on what matters and remain pliable in the Father's hands. Always remember, "...that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ (Philippians 1:6, NKJV)." He's not finished with you yet!
