



## Finding Wisdom in God's Word

### Description

If any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him. (James 1:5)

God's Word is active and it will change how you feel, it will make a difference even when you don't understand it.

So let's take the time to apply the words of James 1:5 to our lives.

*If any of you lacks wisdom...*
